Richard J. Brady

BRAINTREE — Richard J. Brady, 83, of Braintree, a retired post office manager, died Friday following a long illness.

Mr. Brady worked for the postal service for 34 years and was manager of the Chestnut Hill office.

He was a Navy veteran of World War II. He served four years in the South Pacific, on the USS Alchiba, which sustained heavy damage after being torpedoed twice in the Guadalcanal invasion. The ship received the Presidential Unit Citation with three battle stars. Mr. Brady later served aboard the USS Mellette.

He was a member of Knights of Columbus Council 62, the Benevolent Protective Order of Elks and a lifelong member of the Old Charlestown Schoolboys Association.

He was an avid reader whose interests included spectator sports, golf, politics and history.

Mr. Brady was born in Charlestown and graduated from Charlestown High School, where he played on the varsity football team. He lived in Dorchester before moving to Braintree in 1973.

He is survived by his wife of 57 years, Helen F. (McGonagle) Brady; a son, Richard J. Brady Jr. of Dorchester; a daughter, Marsha A. Cannon of Squantum; and three grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10:30 a.m. Tuesday at St. Francis of Assisi Church, 856 Washington St., South Braintree. Burial will be in Blue Hill Cemetery.
