

City of Cambridge.

In Common Council, March 5. 1866.

Whereas, upon making a change in the grade of the Sidewalk on Main Street, near Hancock Street in October last, the City Council voted that the sum of Eight Hundred Dollars should be paid to the owners of the two double houses on the South West-
erly side of Main Street, Easterly of Hancock Street, in full settlement of the claim of said owners against the City, which sum was to be paid when said houses should have been raised.

And whereas William Page, one of said owners, is desirous of raising his half of one of said houses, and Dr. James L. Simonds, the owner of the other part of said house, who was absent from the City when said vote was adopted, declines accepting said offer of the City, or any part thereof, and does not desire to raise his part of said house until his claim for damages shall have been decided.

Ordered, That the Committee on Roads and Bridges be authorized, in the name

and on behalf of the City, to agree to a submission of the claims of said Surchants for damages occasioned by the raising of said Sidewalk to referees, to be chosen and agreed upon by said Surchants and said Committee; - the decision of said referees to be final, and to be in lieu of the offer contained in the vote of the City Council above recited, so far as said Surchants is concerned.
