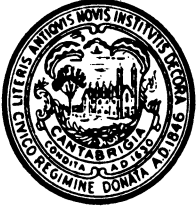
Subject City Council Order #8 dated 1-14-91 Re: Porter Exchange Parking Lot

The Traffic and Parking Department investigated the signing in the Porter Exchange Parking Lot on Jan. 23, 1991. It was determined that there are adequate signs in the parking lot stating that violators will be towed at their own expense.

I do not know the exact location of the space that Ms. Tadd was towed from but judging from her letter she was parked next to the spaces assigned to the Cottonwood Cafe and although the tow signs are small, there are at least five that I observed.

I also understand that I was looking for these signs and saw them more clearly. The law states that signs must be posted but does not state size or color. I will suggest to Mr. Wasserman that the tow signs be painted red on white and that additional "Warning" signs be installed notifying drivers as they enter the parking lot from Massachusetts Avenue.

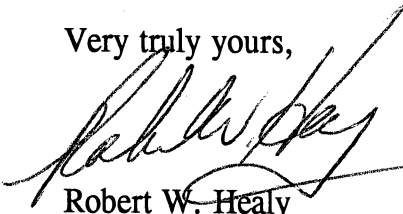
