Dear Mr. Healy,

It is my pleasure to inform you about the recommendation of the Cambridge Republican City Committee, regarding your selection for the four-year term of Election Commissioner, to be appointed this particular year of 1991.

The recommendation results from our meeting held on Thursday evening, March 14, 1991, at the Media Cafeteria, of the Cambridge Rindge and Latin School. The call of the meeting specifically included the business of selecting recommended names for this term of Election Commissioner. The meeting was publicly announced, as scheduled from 7:30P.M. to 9:30P.M., in a short article in the Cambridge Chronicle, and by written notice, sent to all current members of the Cambridge Republican City Committee. Persons entering the meeting were checked for voter registration as Republicans, and membership on their respective ward committees, thereby establishing their eligibility, as members of the City Committee, to receive ballots. Those eligible, received an identifying card; those not eligible, did not receive an identifying card.

At all times during the meeting, which ran from about 7:40P.M. to about 9:15P.M., a quorum of in excess of the required 30 persons, was present. The total attendance was actually at least 47 persons eligible to vote as members of the Cambridge Republican City Committee.

The meeting recommends the following names, ranked in the order of their selection, each receiving a majority of the ballots, cast on successive ballots for that particular ranked choice:

- 1.) Edward J. Samp, Jr. 33 Agassiz Street
Cambridge, Mass. 02140
- 2.) Wayne A. Drugan, Jr. 16 Linnaean Street - No. 2
Cambridge, Mass. 02138

3.) Nancy Butler 100 Memorial Drive - No. 23A
Cambridge, Mass. 02142

Mr. Samp received 43 ballots, to 4 ballots that were cast for Mr. Peter Sheinfeld.

Mr. Samp has indicated his acceptance of the recommendation.

We are pleased to recommend him as our clear, and overwhelming choice to you. He is an individual who has much respect, and in whom we have much confidence.

We would appreciate your earliest action on the reappointment of Mr. Samp.
