Around 9 a.m. yesterday, a hick-
ed American Airline's com-
ercial plane hit the north tower of
e World Trade Center. About 20
inutes later, the second tower was
ruck by another hijacked com-
mercial flight. Both towers later
ollapsed. In the hours that fol-
wed, a hijacked plane crashed
to the Pentagon, and another
ashed near Somerset, Penn. As of
uesday afternoon, no casualty es-
imates were available.
President George Bush has
alled the crashes, "apparent terror-
ist attacks" and "a national
agedy."
"We have a heightened public
ecurity, but we don't expect any
irect threat to the community,"

Healy said.
There were no major cancella-
tions in the city, and all city build-
ings and schools remained open. If
personnel have an emergency they
are welcome to leave, Healy said.
All city meetings were cancelled,
not because of safety precautions
but in observance of the tragedies
that took place, Galluccio said.
"We have markedly increased
police and fire presence throughout
the city," said David O'Connor, the
city's emergency management di-
rector. "All of us have to sit back
and wait and see what's happen-
ing."
O'Connor also mentioned that
the city is providing assistance to
survivors of the attacks.

Local company founder died on Flight 11

Internet content distribution com-
pany Akamai Technologies said
Tuesday that one of its co-founders
was killed when the jet he had
boarded crashed into New York's
World Trade Center.
Daniel C. Lewin who also served
as the Cambridge company's chief
technology officer, was on board
American Airlines Flight 11, en
route from Boston to Los Angeles.
That plane was one of two to hit the
World Trade Center Tuesday morn-
ing, bringing the 110-story towers
crashing to the ground.
Lewin, who was 31, was also a
board member of the company,
which launched its commercial ser-
vice in April 1999. His is survived
by his wife and two sons.
George H. Conrades, chairman

and chief exec-
utive of Aka-
mai, said in a
statement:
"Danny was a
wonderful
human being.
He will be
deeply missed
by his many
friends at Aka-
mai. Our
thoughts and
prayers are
with Danny's family, friends and
colleagues during this time of na-
tional tragedy and personal loss."
Lewin founded Akamai in Sep-
tember 1998, along with Tom
Leighton and a leading group of
Massachusetts Institute of Tech-

nology scientists and business pro-
fessionals. He was a doctoral can-
didate in the Algorithms Group at
MIT's Laboratory for Computer
Science. He has published and pre-
sented several breakthrough papers
at top computer science confer-
ences and is the recipient of several
awards, including the 1998 Morris
Joseph Lewin Award for Best
Masterworks Thesis Presentation
at MIT.
Born in Denver, Colo., and raised
in Jerusalem, Lewin was an officer
in the Israel Defense Forces, having
served in the country's military for
more than four years. He holds a
bachelor of arts and of science,
summa cum laude, from Technion.
He also holds a master's degree
from MIT.
