COUNCILLOR PREUSSER

WHEREAS: Urban dwellers have special need for trees to restore our spirit and provide health-giving elements to the atmosphere; and

WHEREAS: Cambridge is experiencing the loss of many gracious old trees due to disease and the elements, and/or abuse; and

WHEREAS: Many Cambridge citizens feel protective of and personally associated with trees bordering our neighborhood streets and commercial avenues; and

WHEREAS: There is at present no formal process whereby citizens may involve themselves in the selection of trees to be planted whether in newly designated areas or as replacements of trees removed by the City; therefore, be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager be requested to appoint a public planting committee that will function under the guidance and auspices of the Cambridge Conservation Commission; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager report back to the City Council one month from this date as to the implementation of this order.
