That they find on May 27 1846 Edmund G. Dana, and others, conveyed said Square to the City by Deed, said Deed being on file at the Treasurers office. the conditions of the conveyance are, that the city shall always keep the Premises suitably reserved, as an open, ornamental Place, enclosed by a fence, and be used for no other purpose, the Committee would further report that the fence is very much out of repair, some portions of it being gone.
