RESOLVED: That this Cambridge City Council does once again stand on record as calling for the immediate restoration to power of the democratically elected President of Haiti.

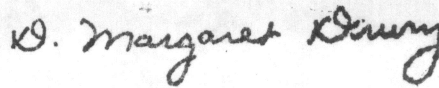
