WHEREAS: Today the Rubino clan has grown to include seventeen grandchildren and four great grandchildren; and

WHEREAS: Joseph "Joe" Rubino was born on June 2, 1920, one of six children born to Mauro and Angela Rubino who emigrated from Barri, Italy; and

WHEREAS: Elise "Dottie" Rubino was born in Somerville on August 25, 1929 and soon went to live with the Travers family at 47 Tremont Street, the house that was later home to the Rubino family as well; and

WHEREAS: Joe and Dottie both grew up in East Cambridge; and

WHEREAS: After attending Cambridge public schools, Joe joined the United States Navy at the outbreak of World War II and fought in the Pacific Theatre; and

WHEREAS: Upon his discharge from the Navy, Joe went to work at the Cambridge Department of Public Works where he held various positions until his retirement in the 1970's; Dottie was a homemaker and was well known within the Portuguese community as a unofficial translator to many immigrant families; and

WHEREAS: After a long illness, Joseph Rubino succumbed to cancer on July 7, 1981; Dottie survived Joe by ten years and passed away on October 25, 1991; and

WHEREAS: Dottie and Joe loved their family, their community and their city; because of their love and their lives, Cambridge is a better place; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council go on record dedicating the corner of Tremont Street and Hampshire Street as "**Dottie and Joe Rubino Square;**" and be it further

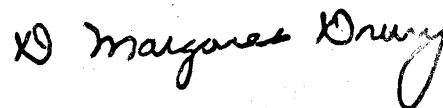
