Dear Aldermen:

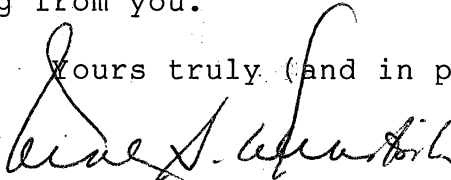
