WHEREAS: The delay in resolving once and for all both the air conditioning and truck noise at Star Market in Porter Square, in a manner consistent with enforced compliance with the City's noise ordinance, suggests an absence of urgency on the part of the City to force compliance and an absence of urgency on the part of Star Market to comply and both attitudes are a source of frustration and anger to residents who live adjacent to Star Market and whose right to the quiet enjoyment of their homes has and is being assaulted; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to report back to this City Council by November 6, 1989 to explain what underlies the appearance that the City and Star Market are treading water in resolving this problem rather than reaching a definitive conclusion which will force an end to the aggravation and intrusion of the referenced noise.
