- WHEREAS: On Wednesday evening, November 29, 1990 a meeting was held at the Haggerty School, which was called by the sub-committee of the School Committee, which is concerned with Buildings and Grounds; and
- WHEREAS: Serious concerns were raised at the meeting regarding the condition of the Haggerty School; and
- WHEREAS: These same concerns have been voiced over, and over again, going back as far as the late sixties and early seventies; and
- WHEREAS: Repairs to the building have only thus far been done in a "band-aid" fashion; and
- WHEREAS: Enrollment at the Haggerty School has increased dramatically, forcing the establishment of an extra kindergarten class this year, and will mean that extra classrooms will be needed very shortly; and
- WHEREAS: The Haggerty School, is not only a school to the neighborhood, but serves as the pivotal point from which many neighborhood functions evolve, including a very active Community School group which serves not only neighborhood elderly, but also teens, and a pre-school program; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager and Director of Human Services Personally attend a tour which will be organized by the parents of the Haggerty School Children and to see first hand, the condition of the building and hear the concerns of the parents; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager confer with the Superintendent of Schools, the Assistant City Manager for Fiscal Affairs, and the Budget Director of the School Department to find funding to construct a new Haggerty School with a gym that will not only serve the physical, educational needs of the school but will also provide a neighborhood teen center, and report back to the City Council.
