- WHEREAS: George held several top administrative positions in the field of education, including the presidency of Monticello College, Illinois, Park College in Missouri and the Chandler School, Boston; and
- WHEREAS: Along with his busy academic career George found time to serve on many local boards, including the Massachusetts Board of Collegiate Authority, the Cambridge YMCA, the Longy School of Music and many others; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the entire Rohrbough family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
