PROCLAIMED: That the Cambridge City Council, in partnership and fellowship with the National Afro-American Black History Celebration declare the theme for the month of February in Cambridge to be "Roots, Achievements and Projections", and in keeping with this theme, we ask all members of our community to reflect on the deep contributions which black Americans have made to the life and hopes and spirit of our nation.
