WHEREAS: JJP provides advocacy to troubled youth at educational hearings long before they are ever charged with crimes; JJP lawyers look to recognized kids' strengths and interests and then help them find work with local businesses; JJP also helps law students and lawyers learn to listen; now therefore be it
