WHEREAS: Much discussion has transpired in the City Council chambers regarding Question 9; and

WHEREAS: It is the sense of this City Councillor that elderly, low and moderate income people are being lead to believe that if vote "Yes" is adopted, there are no alternative programs that could be put in place to protect these people; and

WHEREAS: All of the City Council has been informed and/or met with City Manager Healy to discuss several proposals which the Manager is recommending should Question 9 prevail; and

WHEREAS: The Local Affairs Committee will be meeting on November 22, to discuss various proposed home rule legislations from Brookline and Boston; and

WHEREAS: It is the desire of all Councillors to protect elderly, low and moderate income people; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council goes on public record stating that regardless of whether or not any particular member favors or opposes Question 9, that all Councillors will work together to provide new home rule legislation that will protect elderly, low and moderate income people and to have said legislation in the hands of the Local Affairs Committee by November 22 and in law by January 1, 1995.
