

City of Cambridge.

In Board of Aldermen, August 11, 1860.

Ordered, Whereas by an Act of the Legislature, entitled "An Act in relation to the Towns of Lexington and West-Cambridge," approved by the Governor, March 24, 1860, the said towns were released and exempted from all obligation to pay any portion of any charge that might thereafter arise from rebuilding, repairing or in any way supporting or maintaining the bridge over Charles River between the City of Cambridge and the town of Brighton, formerly known as the "Great Bridge".

Resolved, That the City of Cambridge was, by the passage of said Act, released from any and all obligation to pay any portion of any charge that might arise from rebuilding, repairing or in any way supporting or maintaining any portion of said bridge, or of the draw thereof, not within the limits of said City of Cambridge; and that no portion of any such charge will ^{hereafter} be paid by the City.

Ordered, That the City Clerk be directed to send to the Town Clerks of Brighton, Lexington and West-Cambridge, respectively, an attested copy of the foregoing Resolved.
