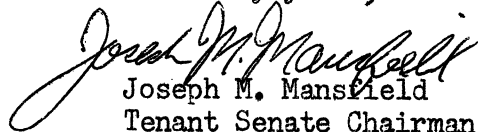
On Wednesday, February 17, 1971 at 11:00 A.M. the Urban Affairs Committee of the Massachusetts Legislature will hold a hearing at the State House on two bills of special interest to the residents of Public Housing. House bills H-2554 and H-2555 would for the first time require the State to provide funds to pay for police/security protection in Public Housing developments.

H-2554 would provide funds to develop a city-wide police/security plan that would protect all elderly and family housing developments; H-2555 would allow future development of a housing authority police department.

Whereas the two bills would do much to provide the necessary safety to all residents of Public Housing, the Tenant Senate requests that the City Council adopt the following resolution:

Be it resolved that the Cambridge City Council supports House bills H-2554 and H-2555 in order that the Public Housing residents of Cambridge may be provided with the police/security protection so vitally needed.
