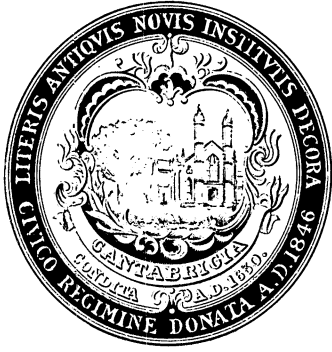

WHEREAS:

A communication has been received from His Honor the Mayor informing the City Council of the death of William R. Davis a former member of the City Government it is fitting and proper that we should record this tribute to his memory.

Mr Davis was born at West Appleton, Maine but shortly after his birth his parents moved to Cambridge where he has since resided. He early entered into the civic life of the city and served in the Common Council, Board of Aldermen and the House of Representatives. He was also a member of the Constitutional Convention. For the past thirty years he has been ^{an} employee of the County of Middlesex, for the past ten years being Chief Deputy Sheriff. In the social life of the city he was also active being a member of Cambridge Lodge of Elks, Odd Fellows, New England Order of Protection and Cambridge Nest of Owls.

His sincerity and honesty drew to him a countless number of friends who will long remember him and who mourn his loss. He gave freely of his time in the public service, was untiring, thorough and conscientious and followed the highest ideals of duty. It is therefore
