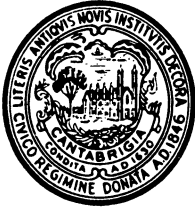
Subject City Council Order #3 of Sept. 30, 1985 "Resident Parking in
Business Areas"

In order to install resident parking in business areas the zoning must be changed from business to residential. The law states that the resident parking areas must be in residential areas. If this change was made it would mean that all parking meters would have to be removed as they are only installed in areas zoned for business or industry.

This change must be done through the Zoning Board and it would also require a public hearing as it would create a problem with spot zoning.
