Ralph served in the U.S. Army between 1941 and 1945 during W.W. II and received the Good Conduct Medal, the Victory Medal, the American Theatre Campaign Ribbon, the Asiatic-Pacific Theatre Campaign Ribbon and the American Defense Service Medal; and

WHEREAS:

In 1946 Ralph married Muriel E. Layne and to that union three daughters Lorriane, Barbara and Patricia and one son Kenneth was born, all whom will miss their father greatly; therefore be it
