

City of Cambridge.

In Board of Aldermen, Dec. 4. 1871.

Whereas it is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that Franklin Street, from Pleasant Street to Putnam Street, should be laid out and widened,

Ordered, That a strip of land as shown upon a Plan drawn by W. S. Barbour, Civil Engineer, dated May 23. 1871. and now before this Board, to wit the land included between the most-Westerly of the two red lines on said Plan, which line extends from Putnam Street to Pleasant Street, and the most-Easterly of said red lines, extending from Putnam Street to Soder Street, and thence by a line as the fences now stand, to Pleasant Street, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered, That damages for the land so

taken and for the removal of fences, &c., be
estimated and awarded as follows:-

To Gardner H. Thwing,

5 square feet of lumber, 75¢ \$3.75

for the removal of 34 feet

of fence - 50¢

17.00

\$20.75

Ordered, That thirty days be allowed to the
persons whose lumber is taken for said work
during, for the removal of their fences.
