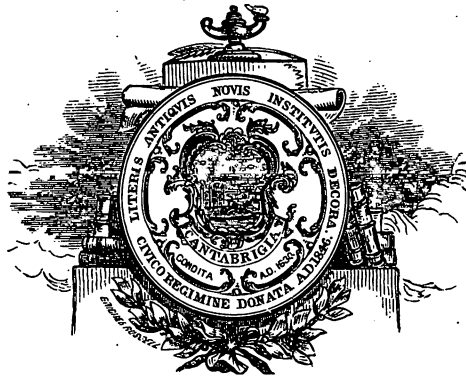


CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.



In Board of Aldermen, *Nov. 30, 1874.*

Resolved, That the public convenience and necessity require that

Pearl Street
Should be widened on its N.W. side,
between Green and William Streets,

by taking for this purpose certain parcels of land, as shown on a plan prepared by the City Engineer, and now before this Board.

Therefore, Ordered, that so much of the land on *the northwesterly side of*
Pearl Street
between Green and William Sts.,

as is included between the *red* lines shown on a plan of *Pearl Street*
on file in the office of
~~Street, drawn by~~ the City Engineer, dated *Dec. 23, 1844* and now before this
Board, be taken for public use, and laid out as a public way and a part of said *Pearl*
~~Street.~~ Street.

Ordered, That damages occasioned by said *widening*
and awarded as follows:
