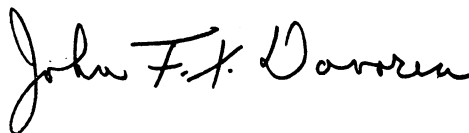

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

To promote, foster, and develop educational and charitable work for the purpose of informing the public of the conditions of hunger, poverty and oppression of people; to support, engage in, promote and manage programs and projects for the purpose of aiding and assisting people afflicted by poverty, hunger, and oppression; and to cooperate with organizations, projects and programs concerned with these matters; to purchase, receive, take by grant, gift, devise, bequest or otherwise, lease, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, improve, employ, use and otherwise deal in and with, real or personal property, or any interest therein, wherever situated; to sell, convey, lease, exchange, transfer or otherwise dispose of, or mortgage, pledge, encumber or create a security interest in, all or any of its property, or any interest therein, wherever situated; to purchase, take, receive, subscribe for, or otherwise, acquire, own, hold, vote,

NOTE: If provisions for which the space provided under Articles 2, 3 and 4 is not sufficient additions should be set out on continuation sheets to be numbered 2A, 2B, etc. Indicate under each Article where the provision is set out. Continuation sheets shall be on 8½" x 11" paper and must have a left-hand margin 1 inch wide for binding. Only one side should be used.

employ, sell, lend, lease, exchange, transfer, or otherwise dispose of, mortgage, pledge, use and otherwise deal in and with, bonds and other obligations, shares, or other securities or interests issued by others, whether engaged in similar or different business, governmental, or other activities; to make contracts, give guarantees and incur liabilities, borrow money at such rates of interest as the corporation may determine, issue its notes, bonds and other obligations, and secure any of its obligations by mortgage, pledge or encumbrance of, or security interest in, all or any of its property or any interest therein, wherever situated; to lend money, invest and reinvest its funds, and take and hold real and personal property as security for the payment of funds so loaned or invested; to do business, carry on its operations, and have offices and exercise the powers granted by this chapter in any jurisdiction within or without the United States; to pay pensions, establish and carry out pension, profit-sharing, share bonus, share purchase, share option, savings, thrift and other retirement, incentive and benefit plans, trusts and provisions for any or all of its directors, officers and employees of any corporation, fifty percent or more of the shares of which outstanding and entitled to vote on the election of directors are owned, directly or indirectly, by it; to be an incorporator of other corporations of any type or kind; to accomplish these purposes, the corporation may solicit, receive and borrow, with or without security, real and personal property, including funds, by way of gifts, contributions and subscriptions, and administer hold, convey, transfer, disburse, lend and sell the same for such charitable and educational purposes as are permitted by section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of the United States, as it now exists and as hereafter amended, and no assets of this corporation shall inure to the benefit of any private individual. Upon dissolution and winding up of this corporation, any remaining assets shall be transferred only to an organization having like charitable and educational purposes as are permitted by section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of the United States. No assets shall be conveyed or distributed to any individual or any organization created or operated for profit. No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, nor shall this corporation take part in any political campaign in behalf of any candidate for public office; to have and exercise all powers necessary or convenient to effect any or all of the purposes for which the corporation is formed; provided that no such power shall be exercised in a manner inconsistent with this chapter or the general laws of the commonwealth and section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended.

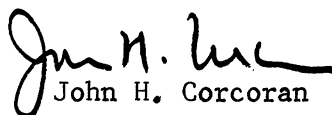
