Life came to a close for Donald Spencer on February 18, 1972 at San Angelo, Texas at the age of sixty-seven years, ending a career which had been devoted to the service of his fellow-man and the government of the City of Cambridge, and

WHEREAS:-

His contributions to the civic life of Cambridge took many forms in many lines of endeavor, as President of Cambridge Civic Association for two terms during the period between March 1949 and March 1951, as a Trustee of the Mt. Auburn Hospital, the Cambridgeport Savings Bank, the Morgan Memorial, and most recently until poor health prompted his resignation as Chairman of the Committee on Housing of the Cambridge Advisory Committee, and

WHEREAS:-

Donald Spencer attended Phillips Academy, Andover and was a member of the Harvard College Class of 1926, and achieved great success in the financial field as an Investment Counselor and as a business executive at the Spencer-Kennedy Laboratories in Boston, and was a pioneer in the development of equipment for cable television, therefore be it

By the City Council of the City of Cambridge that in the death of Donald Spencer the City of Cambridge and its people have lost an outstanding civic leader and friend who successfully combined an outstanding career in the field of business with leadership in Cambridge Civic affairs, and be it further
