To the Honorable the City Council
of the City of Cambridge:-

The undersigned respectfully represents that when Hudson Street
or College, formerly Wrigles-Street, was laid out
and accepted by the City several years since,
it was made twenty-eight-feet in width,
leaving a strip of land belonging to the un-
dersigned on the Southern side of said Street
two feet in width, and lying between the
lands of certain owners and said Street.
Said parcel contains about three hundred
and sixty square feet, and is of no use to
the undersigned, and he respectfully tender
a deed of release of the same to the City,
and prays the acceptance thereof, to the end
that said parcel may be thrown into the
street for the benefit of said owners and
those using said Street.
