

To the Mayor, Board of Aldermen and
Common Council of the City of Cambridge.

Respectfully Represents Isaac S.
Harding of said Cambridge that he is owner
and resident upon the estate situated on the
Corner of Harvard and Clinton Streets in
said Cambridge: that it appears that the
sidewalk adjoining his estate upon said
Clinton Street has been repaired by the Su-
perintendent of Streets or some other one in
Authority within six months past by placing
a curb stone around the said sidewalk and
the said Curb stone has been placed at least
a foot within the line of the remainder of the
Curb stone from his Estate to Main Street, Mak-
ing the sidewalk narrower and injuring the ap-
pearance of the same, and of his Estate.

He therefore prays that the said Curb stone
may be removed on a line with the rest
of the sidewalk to widen the sidewalk.
