WHEREAS: The adequate provision of services to the homeless people of this city is of great importance to this City Council; and

WHEREAS: The Salvation Army Adult Drop-In Center in Cambridge's Central Square serves up to 200 homeless men and women per day and functions as the daytime drop-in center for the community; and

WHEREAS: The two staff counselors on duty are responsible for serving meals, providing crisis intervention, informal counseling, and referrals; and

WHEREAS: The demands of providing the most basic needs to homeless people, including food, clothing, and safety, are so great that there is little time left for any in-depth assistance to clients; and

WHEREAS: In order to begin working on a plan to end the cycle of homelessness, and begin to address the underlying issues leading to each individual's homelessness it is crucial that a trained social worker is available to provide in-depth attention to each client; and

WHEREAS: The Salvation Army Adult Drop-In Center is requesting funding for such a social worker, in the amount of \$30,000; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council request the City Manager to study the Salvation Army's request for funding with a view in mind to providing the full amount.
