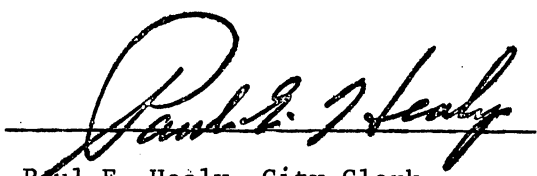
MAYOR RUSSELL

- WHEREAS: Bicycling as recreation, transportation, and sport is enjoyed by one out of every two Massachusetts citizens; and
- WHEREAS: In 1984, Massachusetts bicycle fatalities involving a child between the ages of 5 and 19 dropped by 52.6% from the preceding year; and
- WHEREAS: State, School and community programs designed to improve bicyclists' awareness of the need for proper bicycle maintenance and observance of the "rules of the road", helped lead to this significant reduction in fatal bicycle accidents; and
- WHEREAS: On Saturday, May 4, 1985, from 1:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M. the Registry of Motor Vehicles will sponsor a "Safe Driving Practices" program at City Hall Plaza in Boston where several concurrent activities are planned for that day including workshops on Safety and Equipment, Bicycle Inspection, and Safe Driving Practices as well as a Bike Rodeo; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council do hereby proclaim the month of May as "BICYCLE SAFETY MONTH" in the City of Cambridge with special attention given to "Safe Driving Practices", and urge all citizens, educators and community leaders to take note of this event and to fittingly participate in its observance.
