WHEREAS: James was a member of the 1949 Boston College, NCAA Championship Hockey Team, and scored the winning goal in the final game; and

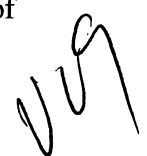
WHEREAS: James was a member of the Boston College Athletic Hall of Fame; and
