Born in Canton, Mrs. Quinn was a longtime resident of Cambridge.

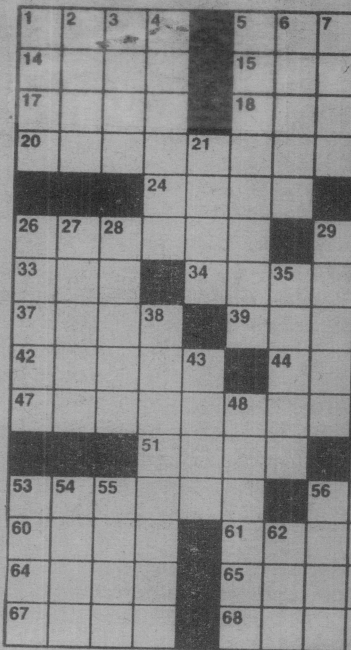
Mrs. Quinn was a member of St. John's Women's Guild.

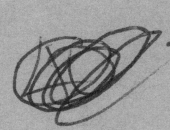
