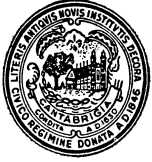

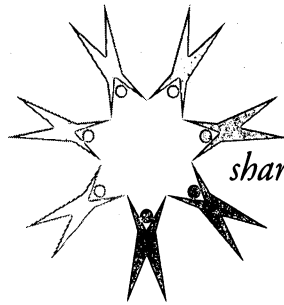

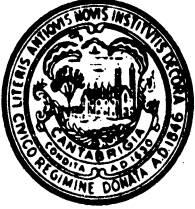

The following is offered in response to Council Order Number 35, dated 11/23/98 regarding "report on outdoor ice skating in Cambridge."

The Department of Public Works, in conjunction with the Director of Recreation is currently working on having the ice rinks installed in time for school vacation at the Glacken Field Tennis Courts and Riverside Press Basketball Courts. In addition, a new type of heavy duty liner will be used which will hopefully improve upon the ability to hold the water and related freezing capacity at both of these sites. During the past winter season, due to a variety of conditions including climate and durability of the liners, there were only a few days of skating at both of the sites. With this in mind, it is recommended that future expansion of sites in East and North Cambridge be held off until the success of the present rinks can be determined.

In regard to the East Cambridge/Lechmere Canal, further investigation will be done in order to determine the potential for freezing this area for ice skating.
