

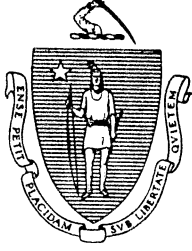

# The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

IN THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY- TWO

## AN ACT AUTHORIZING ESTIMATED TAX PAYMENTS IN THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE

As delayed implementation could tend to defeat the purpose of this act, it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public safety and convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary, the City of Cambridge is undertaking a general revaluation of its property under a program approved by the commissioner of revenue for completion and implementation for fiscal year nineteen hundred and eighty-three. If the commissioner of revenue is satisfied that full and fair valuations will be established prior to February first, nineteen hundred and eighty-three for certification under paragraph (c) of section two A of chapter fifty-nine of the General Laws and if the said commissioner acknowledges, in writing, that these conditions have been met, the City of Cambridge is hereby authorized to issue a notice of estimated tax and require the payment of such estimated tax, which shall in no event exceed fifty percent of the tax payable during the preceding fiscal year, in lieu of the

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Any and all provisions incorporated in any general or special law regarding the procedures for issuing, mailing, and collecting tax assessments upon real and personal property shall be applicable to the notice of estimated tax provided hereunder. To the extent that any rights or remedies under law accrue from the date that the tax bill is issued, only the actual tax bill issued upon the establishment of the actual tax rate shall govern such rights or remedies.

The provisions of section twenty-one C of chapter fifty-nine shall apply to the actual tax rate established by the City of Cambridge.

This act shall take effect upon its passage.
