WHEREAS: The focus of this march is the violence against women which runs rampant in the United States and globally; and

WHEREAS: Women must unite for protection and strength and find support in one another since violence is not a class- or color-related struggle, but a horrendous deformity of society that affects all women; and

WHEREAS: The program at the high school will feature women's hopes, rights, and accomplishments; and

WHEREAS: The march and program are co-sponsored by the Cambridge Women's Commission, the Cambridge Peace Commission, Students Against Violence and for Equality (SAVE), and Youth for Peace; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council encourages residents to join in celebration of International Women's Day in Cambridge; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution for presentation at the International Women's Day celebration.
