To The Cambridge City Council,

The honourable Daniel Hayes, who serves as Chairman of the Cambridge Laboratory Experimentation Review Board, has contacted my office this past Friday with some important information.

The Board is unable to adequately review all relevant material prior to the expiration of the moratorium on October 7, 1976. This is due in part to the fact that N.I.H. has not as yet promulgated its Environmental Impact Statement, a document which the Board would like to consider.

He has suggested to Harvard and MIT that a 3 month extension of the moratorium would be appropriate. I have today contacted Harvard and MIT and they have agreed to extend the moratorium for an additional 3 months.

As such, I suggest that the Council tonight adopt an order which will make official this understanding.
