To the City Council.

Gentlemen:

The City Engineer to whom was referred the petition of Charles M. Stratton and others relating to renumbering certain streets, as also an order passed April 6th directing the renumbering of the several streets in the City upon a uniform system; together with the report of the Joint Standing Committee on Roads and Bridges of June 29th last, upon the petition of Orrin Hall and others that Shepard Street be renumbered; makes the following report.

During the past season I have caused to be made a complete canvass of all the principal and occupied streets of the City, noting particularly the character, occupancy, and present numbers of all buildings upon said streets, and measuring carefully the frontage of each occupied lot and unoccupied lands.

In view of the necessity and increasing demand for the adoption of a much more systematic observance of numbering our streets, with reference not only to present convenience, but of future benefit, this course became necessary as preliminary to determining with any degree of satisfaction

the most appropriate method of numbering the streets in different sections of the City, some of which, are now occupied in whole or in part for business purposes, and others for dwellings, also for applying proper numbers to those destined subsequently to a change in this respect.

In addition to the information thus obtained there remains a very considerable amount of office duty, more arduous in its nature, which the pressing demands of more immediate work adapted to the season has thus far precluded.

I have therefore deemed it to be for the interest of the City to defer the completion of said work until coming inclement weather will allow its completion, for which action I would respectfully ask the sanction of the City Council.

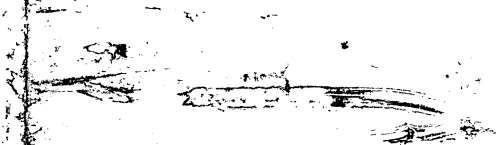
