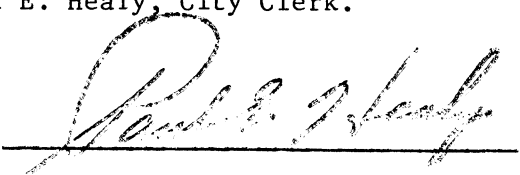

- WHEREAS: In more and more Cambridge families with young children, both parents or an only parent are working outside the home, creating an increasing need for high quality child care; and
- WHEREAS: The eight after-school and four pre-school child-care programs sponsored by the Cambridge Department of Human Service Programs are currently funded through Neighborhood Councils, in competition with many other deserving programs; and
- WHEREAS: The increased demand for this excellent municipal child care threatens to render this current arrangement insufficient to meet the needs of Cambridge families; therefore, be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager cause the Assistant City Manager for Human Services to study the possibility of direct funding of municipal child care services, either through the general fund or through human services block grant funds; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Manager report the findings and recommendations of this study to the City Council as soon as possible.

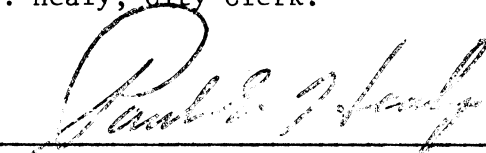
