Men and women over forty years of age make up approximately forty-five percent of the national labor force, and

WHEREAS:

More and more employers are recognizing the value of older workers, and

WHEREAS:

The Federal Government has initiated efforts to hasten the elimination of an unrealistic bias against older workers and to point out the many contributions of the older worker to our national well being, now therefore be it

RESOLVED:

That I, Walter J. Sullivan, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, do hereby endorse the efforts of our Federal Government on behalf of the older workers and designate the week of March 9th - 15th, 1975 as "Employ the Older Worker Week" here in the City of Cambridge, and urge all employers of this area to give special consideration to the skills and qualifications of those men and women forty years of age and older, and be it further

RESOLVED:

That all public officials within the City of Cambridge who are responsible for job placement, counseling, training and re-training services intensify, throughout this week and throughout the entire year, their efforts to help older workers find suitable jobs and training opportunities.
