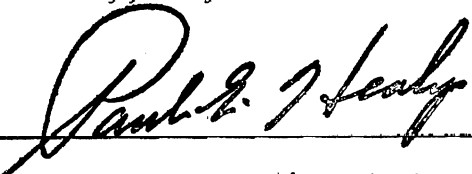

COUNCILLOR WALTER SULLIVAN

- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Lena DiCicco, a long time Cambridge and Gloucester area resident and a pioneer in alcohol rehabilitation; and
- WHEREAS: Lena graduated from Emanuel College in 1944 on a four-year scholarship and later earned her Master's Degree in 1948 from Yale University; and
- WHEREAS: Lena had spent the past twenty-five years of her life working in the area of alcoholic rehabilitation and was widely recognized in many states as an expert and pioneer and has served as Director of the Cambridge and Somerville Program for Alcoholism Rehabilitation (CASPAR); and
- WHEREAS: Lena's work and programs have been recognized by the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse, the Massachusetts Department of Mental Health and the Rutgers Center of Alcohol Studies; and
- WHEREAS: In addition to her alcoholism work, she was also active in Boston's Catholic Interracial Council from 1964 to 1970, serving as President from 1968 to 1970 and in that capacity, was instrumental in urging the late Richard Cardinal Cushing to earmark \$2 million dollars of the annual Jubilee collection to combat racism in the inner city; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the DiCicco family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family on behalf of the entire City Council.
