Founded in 1971 at Newton College of the Sacred Heart, Cambridge College is dedicated to increasing professional effectiveness as a means of renewing society. and has graduated over 1,800 in the Metropolitan Boston area; and

WHEREAS:

The College's innovative curriculum utilizes the student's worksite as a vehicle for integrating theory and practice; and

WHEREAS:

Cambridge College is extremely proud of its diverse learning community, and is deeply committed to providing access to their programs to those adults who have lacked entry to higher education through traditional learning channels; therefore be it

That this City Council go on record as recognizing the valuable work of the Cambridge College/Institute of Open Education and as encouraging its continued contributions to society through innovative educational philosophy and practices; and be it further
