In recognition of the long and faithful service of said Police Sergeant Charles H. Preshe for more than thirty-seven years continuously in this important department of the city, we desire to express appreciation.

Sergeant Preshe became a member of the department February 4, 1896 and was promoted to the office of sergeant on June 30, 1917. On January 20, 1922 he was placed in charge of the Liquor Squad. During his long period of service he has engaged in other special work requiring courage and good judgment. His service has at all times met the approval and commendation of his superior officers.

Now that he has become physically incapacitated for further duty we desire to express our best wishes for his future happiness in his retirement.
