- WHEREAS: Veteran Cambridge Police Sergeant Dominic R. Scalese will retire from active duty effective Wednesday, October 31, 1990, having completed 40 years of service to the people of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: Dominic entered the department on March 20, 1950, attended the Police Academy and upon graduation was assigned as a patrol officer in sector car 8 and after working the sector for 2 years he became the route man in Inman Square for the next eleven years; and
- WHEREAS: The late Police Chief Daniel Brennan, recognizing his investigative talent, transferred Dominic to the Criminal Investigation Division (C.I.D.) where he remained for nearly twenty years with the exception for his brief tour of duty in the Narcotic Bureau and later upon being promoted to the rank of Sergeant, was transferred to his present assignment, as Assistant Director of the Cambridge Police Academy; and
- WHEREAS: Sergeant Scalese a former member of the United States Marine Corps having served his country during World War II has always exemplified the Marine Corps motto "semper fidelis", "always be faithful" throughout his career as a member of the Cambridge Police Department; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its sincere appreciation and and gratitude to Sergeant Dominic R. Scalese for his tireless dedication to the department and the people of Cambridge; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitable resolution for presentation to Sergeant Scalese on behalf of the entire City Council.
