WHEREAS: Keith Adams, a Cambridge resident for more than fifty years, was deeply involved in her community including activity in the League of Women Voters and early involvement in the conceptualization of Danehy Park; and

WHEREAS: Keith Adams pioneered in teaching children remedial reading and in tutoring learning-disabled children since the 1940's; and

WHEREAS: Keith Adams was also an active member of St. Peter's parish and served as a playground monitor and lunch program supervisor at St. Peter's School; and

WHEREAS: Keith Adams always retained a special affinity for children and touched the lives of countless Cambridge children, particularly those who lived near and attended St. Peter's School; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the tot lot adjacent to St. Peter's Field be dedicated to the memory of Keith Adams; and be it further

RESOLVED: That a suitable plaque naming the tot lot "Keith Adams Tot Lot" be erected upon completion of the play space.
