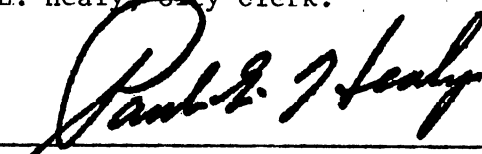
COUNCILLOR VELLUCCI

- ORDERED: That the City Clerk research the ancient legislative enactments which mandated that three cannons, referred to as "War Dogs" be placed on the Cambridge Common and never removed, in mute testimony to their great contribution to the American Revolution and the evacuation of Boston from their positions on Dorchester Heights where they were placed after a long and arduous journey over land and stream from Fort Ticonderoga under the brilliant leadership of Colonel Knox; and be it further
- ORDERED: That an investigation be conducted to determine what has happened to the third cannon, which has been removed from its place on Cambridge Common.
