City Treasurer and Collector of
Taxes.

Be it ordained by the City
Council of the City of Cambridge,
as follows,

Section 1. On and after the first
day of January in the year one
thousand eight hundred and fifty
seven, the Treasurer and Collector
of Taxes, shall receive the following
annual salaries, to be paid in equal
quarterly payments, which shall be in
full for all services rendered in their
official capacity, viz:—

The City Treasurer, three
hundred dollars,

The Collector of Taxes, seven
hundred dollars.

Section 2. All Ordinances, or parts

of Ordinances, inconsistent
therewith are hereby repealed.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred
and Fifty-six.

An Ordinance

Establishing the Compensation of the City Treasurer
and the Collector of Taxes.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of
Cambridge as follows, viz:

Section I. On and after the first Monday of Janu-
ary in the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-
seven, the City Treasurer shall receive an annual Sal-
ary of Three Hundred Dollars, to be paid in equal
quarterly payments, and the Collector of Taxes shall
receive the sum of Seven Hundred Dollars, which shall
be in full for his services in collecting the taxes as-
sessed for the year in which he was chosen Collector,
& all fees for summonses, warrants, & other services, received by him, shall
be paid into the City Treasury. (over)

Section II. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances
inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

An Ordinance
Establishing the office of City Messenger.

Be it Ordained by the City Council
of the City of Cambridge, as follows:

Sect. I. There shall be annually chosen in the month of January, by concurrent vote of both branches of the City Council, a messenger to the City Council, who shall hold his office for one year, and until another is chosen in his place, subject to removal, at any time, by the City Council.

Sect. II. The said messenger shall have the general care and custody of the City Hall, and of the various apartments thereof. He shall wait upon all committees and boards, when in session, at the City Hall, and, in general, shall perform all services required by the Mayor, by either branch of the City Council, or by such committees or boards, and shall receive such compensation as the City Council may, from time to time, determine.
