the City of Cambridge*

Gentlemen :

The City of Chelsea having suffered some pecuniary loss by what its citizens believe to be unjust legislation, so far as it relates to the care of Snow and Ice on SIDEWALKS, contained in Chapter 52, Section 18, of the Public Statutes, has, through its Board of Aldermen, appointed his Honor the Mayor and two members of the Board a special committee to consider the expediency of procuring an amendment to said chapter, so that the cities and towns of the Commonwealth may secure more equitable legislation, and such as will be consistent with reasonable care and diligence under the severities of our Northern climate.

If this meets your approval, will your Board kindly take immediate action on this communication, and appoint a committee with whom we may confer as to methods and means to secure the results desired ?
