An Ordinance  
in relation to the Keeping of Swine.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:-

Sec. 1. The Mayor and Aldermen are authorized to prohibit the keeping of swine in any part or parts of the city where they shall deem that the keeping of such animals would be detrimental to the health or comfort of the citizens in the neighborhood thereof residing, or passing, and shall have power to remove or cause to be removed any swine from any place where the keeping of such animals is prohibited.

Sec. 2. Any and every person who shall keep any swine in any place in the city in which the keeping of such animals is prohibited, or from which he is required to remove the same, six days after having received notice in writing from the Mayor and Aldermen to remove the same, or that such animals are

prohibited from being kept in such place, shall for-  
feit and pay ~~the sum of~~ a sum not exceeding Twenty Dollars,  
and every animal so kept, for each and every day  
during which he shall so keep the same or any of  
them.

In Common Council Dec. 11th 1841.

Amended by Addition of the following, viz.

Section 3. No person shall remove or carry, in along  
or through, any of the streets, squares, courts  
lanes, avenues or places or alleys of the City of  
Cambridge any house offal, or any refuse  
substances, either animal or vegetable,  
from any of the dwelling houses or other  
places in the city, unless such person  
so removing or carrying the same, and  
the mode in which the same shall be  
removed or carried shall have been  
expressly licensed by the Mayor and  
Aldermen, upon such terms and

conditions as they shall deem the health and interest of the City require.

Sec. 4. Any person who shall offend against any of the provisions of the foregoing sections shall forfeit and pay not less than one dollar nor more than twenty dollars.
