To the Honorable, the City Council
Cambridge, Massachusetts.

Gentlemen:

Over a period of more than twenty years, the people of the upper wards of Cambridge have been plagued by incessant dump fires. At present, out-of-town industrial concerns are dumping highly inflammable refuse in our local dump thereby adding to the inconvenience suffered by the people in that immediate locality.

If present unconfirmed reports are true and the City of Cambridge intends using the New Street end of the clay pits as a new dumping area, it is the duty of the City Council to inquire if this is to be the beginning of another gigantic dump in this section. Small home owners in the Field, Dale, Alpine and Garden Streets' district have spent considerable time and money in building up their properties and they are entitled to know what plans, if any, are under consideration insofar as the clay pits are concerned.

The Rindge Avenue permanent veterans housing project when completed will be almost in line with the New Street proposal, if the latter scheme is adopted; it would seem very poor planning to start a dump in the vicinity of a million dollar investment.

The people of Wards 9, 10 and 11 are entitled to know if any changes are being considered with regard to dumping in this neighborhood.


