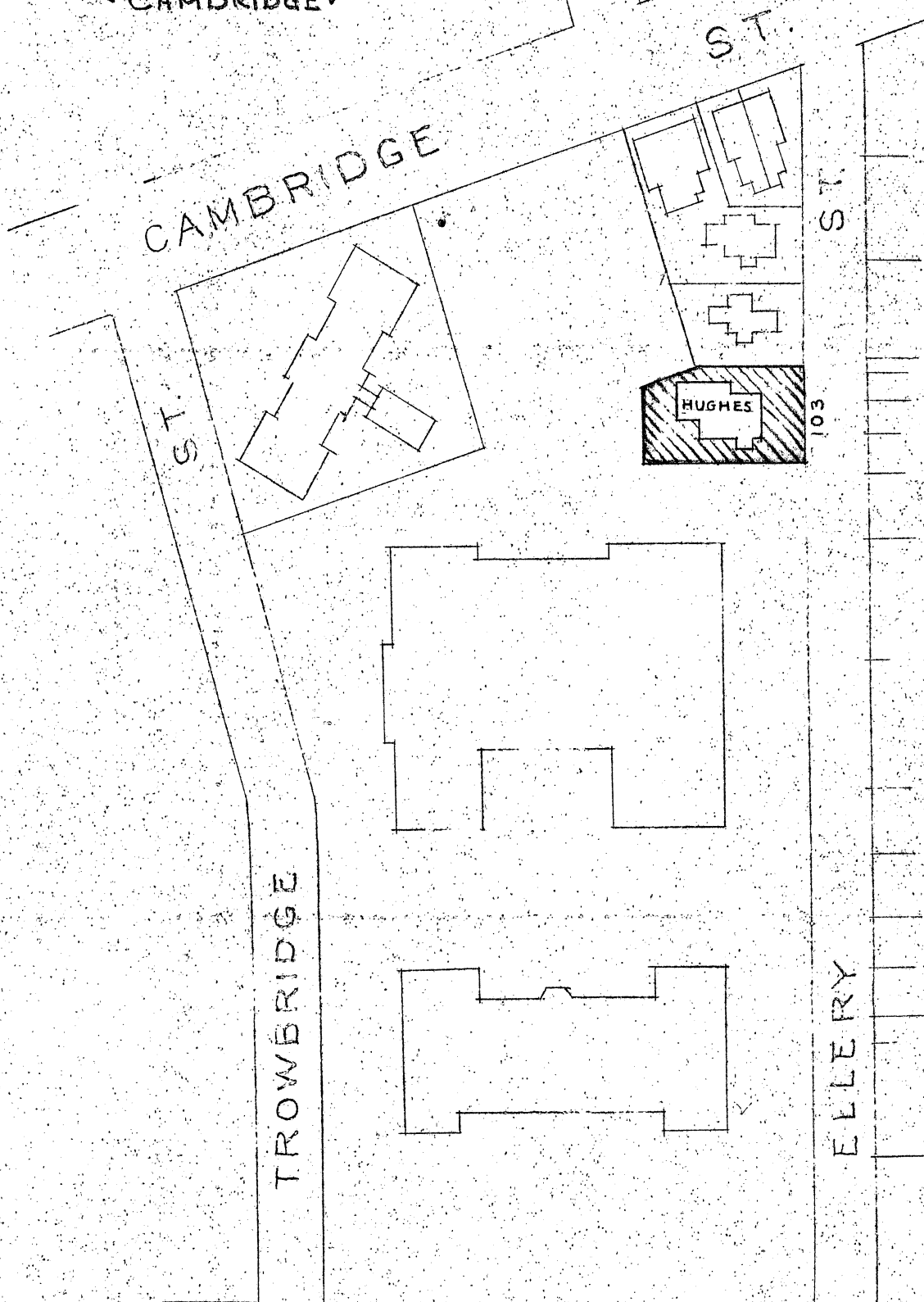


PLAN

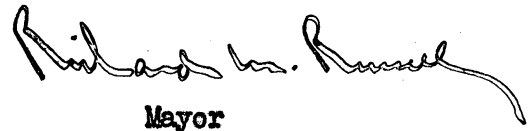

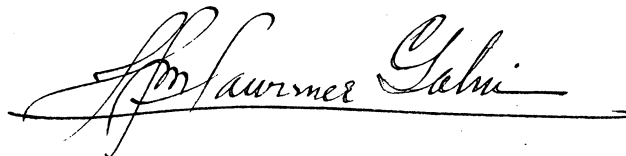
Dear Mayor Russell:
