WHEREAS: American armed forces are now in action, risking their lives in order to liberate Kuwait from the brutal occupation of its Iraqi invaders, and

WHEREAS: Opponents of such U.S. military action had the opportunity to make their case to the American People and Congress, despite which, after lengthy debate, Congress voted to authorize such action, and

WHEREAS: The U.S. congress, led by those who had opposed military action, including our own Congressional delegation, has now nearly unanimously voted to support that effort in hopes of soon achieving victory, and

WHEREAS: By indiscriminate attacks on civilian areas of Israel and Saudi Arabia, mistreatment of prisoners of war, environmental terrorism, and threats to again use outlawed chemical weapons, Sadaam Hussein has demonstrated his brutal nature, intransigence and disregard for human life, and

WHEREAS: Continued demonstrations of opposition to U.S. military action will surely encourage Sadaam Hussein's intransigence in defying the world's demands that he leave Kuwait, and

WHEREAS: Such intransigence can only prolong military action, at the cost of even more human lives; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council, heretofore unanimously opposed to military action in the Gulf, now expresses its hopes for rapid Allied success in fulfilling the United Nations' mandate with a minimum of civilian, American and Allied casualties; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the Council respectfully urges, for the time being, that those who have opposed such military action, join us in voluntary ceasing to publicly demonstrate their opposition, for the reasons stated previously. Nothing herein should be construed as an attempt or intention to in any way deny or abridge others' Constitutional rights to differ from our views on this matter.
